## Latin America Handicrafts Week Kuwait, January 23-27, 2017

The State of Kuwait, represented by the National Council for Culture, Arts & Letters, hosted a Handicrafts event of Latin America, one of the World Crafts Council regions, during the period 23<sup>rd</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2017.

This was the third International Handicrafts Event to be organized by the National Council for Culture, Arts & Letters, in collaboration with the Presidency of the Asia Pacific Region, based in the State of Kuwait for the past & current terms 2013 – 2020.

The Inter-Regional gathering included 11 countries (Argentina, Barbados, Chile, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Mexico, Paraguay, Uruguay, Venezuela) from Latin America, together with other countries from Asia Pacific Region namely: the hosting country (State of Kuwait), the Sultanate of Oman, the Kingdom of Bahrain, and the State of Qatar (West Asia subregion), Uzbekistan (Central Asia subregion), and Bhutan (South Asia subregion).

The opening ceremony of the Latin America Handicrafts "Exhibition" took place on January 23,2017, at the Kuwait National Library, and was inaugurated by the Secretary General of the National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters, Engr.Ali Youha.

The Latin America Handicrafts "Workshop" was also held on January 23,2017, at Beit al-Bader, in the Kuwait National Museum and inaugurated as well by the Secretary General of the National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters, Engr.Ali Youha, where artisans demonstrated their craft-skills to the visitors. They as well exchanged and shared their handicrafts knowledge, expertise and marketing techniques with one another.

Moreover, a catalogue with brief information on each of the participating Latin American countries and their traditional crafts, is published in three languages - Arabic, English and Spanish.

A one day lecture was organized on this occasion. The Lecturers were: Dr.Alberto de Betolaza, President of WCC-Latin America, Dr.Kevin Murray, Vice President of South Pacific and SVP of Asia Pacific Region, and myself, Ghada Hijjawi-Qaddumi, President of WCC-Asia Pacific Region.

Such crafts' gatherings serve the objective and mission of the World Crafts Council towards promoting handicrafts, and supporting the craftspeople on regional and global levels. They also emphasize the collaboration amongst the

people of the world through the support and patronage of the State of Kuwait represented by the NCCAL.
